Informed public about the Petenwell, Castle Rock and Wisconsin River Watershed and PACRS by holding a public meeting called Wisconsin River 101.	2007
Informed public about Wisconsin River Power Company's FERC license requirements to improve water quality by developing a FERC License summary.	2007
WDNR educated PACRS about methods for establishing specific phosphorus limits.	2007
PACRS initiated communications with WDNR regarding the stalled wastewater discharge permit for Domtar-Rothchild plant. Communications resulted in WDNR moving the permit forward for proposed approval.	2008
WDNR educated PACRS about water level fluctuations and the effects they have on the Flowage's ecosystem.	2008
Participated in the Wisconsin River Power Company planning process to change the winter drawdown to a slow gradual drawdown instead of a rapid drawdown thus aquatic plants will be allowed to grow which will use incoming phosphorus.	2008
PACRS participated in a public hearing to provide comment on a site where too many piers were placed with no permit approval. The excess number of piers provided a negative impact on water quality and aquatic plant habitat.	2008
PACRS, with assistance from River Alliance of Wisconsin, developed a strategy and received funding for organizing the PACRS into a formal organization.	2008
Conducted a tour of Petenwell and Castle Rock Flowages for state and federal legislators (Pontoons and Politics) for the purpose of educating the legislators about water quality issues.	2008
Developed a "canned" resolution that citizens can take to their town or village boards in support of efforts to clean up the flowages.	2009
Encouraged WDNR to implement a "Total Maximum Daily Load" study for Big Eau Pleine River	2009
Presented "Wisconsin River 101" educational forum in Juneau County.	2009
Developed a presentation about PACRS goals and activities and presented it to town boards, association boards, etc.	2009
Developed relations with upstream counties to communicate downstream concerns by conducting a bus tour of farming areas in Wood and Portage Counties.	2009
