Medications

- Accepting unused prescriptions, over-the-counter & pet medications
- Empty all pills into a sandwich sized, sealable bag
- Keep all liquids, creams and powders in original containers
- Do not pour medications down the sink or flush down the toilet
- No Sharps (needles, lancets)

1/2 Price Tires

- Car & Light truck
- \$4.00 on or off rim
 - Loads over 10 and large tires will be weighed & charged half price: \$175/ton

1/2 Price Appliances (\$7.50 each)

- Air Conditioners
- Boilers
- Dehumidifiers
- Dishwashers
- Freezers (empty)
- Furnaces
- Microwaves
- Stoves/Ovens
- Refrigerators
- Washers/Dryers

Why Participate?

When disposed of improperly, household and agricultural hazardous materials can threaten the quality of our drinking water, increase the threat of algae bloom and threaten the safety of sanitation workers.

Hazardous materials left around the house and garage pose an accidental poison risk to children and pets.

Who Can Participate?

All Adams County residents and farmers may participate free of charge.

Materials NOT Accepted:

- Latex paint (see below)
- CFL and fluorescent light bulbs
- Propane cylinders and gas tanks
- Vehicle and household batteries
- Explosives and ammunition
- Radioactive material (smoke detectors)

Latex Paint

Latex paint is not hazardous since it is made from water. Consider donating usable paint to friends, theater groups or housing assistance organizations

Latex paint disposal guidelines:

For small amounts: remove the lid and let dry in the can. Stir the paint occasionally to speed drying time

For large amounts: Place equal amounts of an absorbent material (kitty litter, sawdust, oil dry) to the paint and mix with a stick

Dispose of the dried paint and dried cans in the regular garbage

Anything with a cord will be considered an electronic, including TV's!
(Appliances are not considered electronics)

Household Guidelines:

- No liquids over five gallons in size
- No trailer sized loads
- Keep material in the original container with labels
- Unknown materials may be brought in, but may also be refused
- If you have large volumes or liquids over five gallons, call ahead to make special arrangements
